recycling with a

This festival's recycling program incorporates an innovative system which ensures that a minimum of waste is generated and sent to landfill.

We'll be recycling all organic material from kitchens and toilets. These precious resources will go to a nearby property where they'll be composted and returned to agricultural soil.

What can you do to make sure it works?

Because all organic waste from campers, visitors and stallholders at the festival will eventually be applied as compost to soils to grow food, it must be clean. So be sure to put all of your food waste, **including paper plates and napkins,** into the public food waste bins and all of your bottles and cans into the recycling bins. The bins will be in sets of three: a food waste bin, a recycling bin and a waste to landfill bin.

Campers

Five compostable food waste bags will be given to campers for the organic waste generated from their camp site over the weekend. These bags, when full, should be placed into the food waste bins. This material will be taken to a trailer at the Food Waste Stall then out to a local farm where it will be composted and returned to soil.

Food stalls

Food waste will be collected in small buckets and taken to the Food Waste Stall, where we will demonstrate how you can turn food waste into fertiliser as part of our soils workshops.

Other recyclables and general waste will be collected by council trucks.

Toilet waste will sealed in wheeled bins and taken to a local farm for processing and use in soils.

SOIL / FOOD WORKSHOPS

This year the Majors Creek Festival recycling program is focused on food. We are taking all of the organic waste from the festival and using it to improve farming soils. Workshops will be held on Composting, Landcare and Food as Fertiliser.

Composting – Making great compost: **9.30 am, 3.30 pm** Landcare – Understanding your soil: **11.30 am, 5.30 pm** Food as Fertiliser – Making Biofertilisers: **1.30 pm**

Composting - Making great compost:

A workshop to help you learn the basics of making good compost. In this workshop you will get your hands dirty learning the different ways to make quality compost. Composting is an important way to manage organic materials including manures, hay, green waste, pack shed waste, animal carcasses and food scraps. The process involves mixing organic materials together, pushing the mixture into a pile or windrow, adding moisture and then allowing the pile to decompose in a controlled manner. There are a number of methods to making compost. The most common is through the use of a compost turner to add air to the compost pile. This workshop will look at another way to make compost where we will be using an inoculant and a cover. 90 mins

Landcare - Understanding your soil - Worms as Gardeners of the soil - Compost Tea Brewing:

In this interactive workshop you will jump deep into your soil to learn how it works and how to make it healthy for growing great plants! In terms of management of our landscape and food production systems, Landcare is one of the most important community developments in Australia's modern history. It addresses issues such as soil management and biodiversity, landscape and water management, food security and ongoing production. This workshop will look at local property management through the eyes of Landcare members. 90 mins

Food as Fertiliser - Making Biofertilisers:

A workshop to help you learn how to make biofertilisers at home using simple ingredients. This hands-on workshop will cover a number of biofertilisers that can be made by fermenting simple materials in the backyard or on the farm. This workshop will convert food waste from stalls at the Majors Creek Festival into fertiliser. It uses an easily made inoculant product, which is based on biology captured form the air. Very similar in many ways to open ferments used in the processes to make sauerkraut, kimchi and tofu, the workshop will demonstrate the simple stages in making the product. It will also demonstrate how easily food waste and other materials can be processed into a foliar fertiliser for your house and garden or farm and chook yard. 90 mins
