

When 'Music at the Creek' Festival teamed Dave and Damon together as part of a multi-billing 'guitar-olympics' feature, the pair noticed a certain musical spark. When the pair held an impromptu stage performance the following year, they knew there was something worth pursuing. Now work has begun on pre-production for a recording of their own 'folked up blues': Acoustic Roots 'n Groove A stage set for O'Neill and Davies presents four guitars, a double bass, a violin and a mandolin, and a harmonica in the back pocket just in case! These two share a willingness to explore uncharted musical territory together; to base their shows on spontaneity and adventure whilst performing at the highest possible standard. O'Neill and Davies have the potential to be another Aussie export to Europe and the U.S.
