



To round it out there are also a couple of the band's original songs and tunes - including the title track 'Trip to Trundle.' (Trundle is little lovely town in South-Western NSW which the band visits regularly). As well as being good songs which are pleasing to listen to, the band hopes that the material it has chosen captures some of the folklore, values and traditions that have helped shape today's Australia.






