Information Tent: For general information, CD purchase, programmes:

CD Sales: In the information tent;

Bar & Sessions: Enjoy a chat and quiet drink or join in a session: this year selling locally

produced cider and mead;

Toilets & Showers: Several portaloos are situated in and around the camping ground and venues. Septic toilets with new non-flush system for the male toilets means less flushing and less smells; Showers are available in Braidwood at the Ex-Servicemen's Club for a small fee;


Local Talent at the Creek this year

Acapalerang Sun Church 11:30-12:00 noon

Acapalerang is a community singing group based in Braidwood. The group was started in 2006 with the idea of inviting people to enjoy the pleasures of singing and harmonising with each other, without having to know music theory or read notes. This year at The Creek we will bring you a selection of the acapella-style pieces we have been learning throughout the year, with audience participation welcomed!

Braidwood Cantors Sat Hall 5:45-6:30pm

The Braidwood Cantors have been singing together for 20 years, give or take the departures of some old timers and the waves of 'blow ins'. We sing a diverse repertoire - basically whatever takes our fancy, or whatever occasion crops up. 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





Festival Yoga - Dan Bakker: Dance Floor Sat & Sun 8-9am

WORKSHOPS FOR EVERYONE

The Singing Soldier - Luke Carroll: Workshop Tent Sat 5-6pm

Luke is a man with a story to tell. A former soldier with an interest in both music and history, he has combined the two in an unusual presentation that covers the period from the Boer War to the present day. 
